

#### **Chairing Meetings**

Set clear agendas

Ensuring everyone is heard

Keep things on track

## **Conflict Management**

Address disagreements respectfully

Mediate when needed

Keep in contact with VPSA/Soc Officer for support

#### Delegation

Share tasks fairly and ensure all committee members take ownership of their responsibilities

Trust your committee to complete their tasks to a good standard

Check in regularly to ensure everyone's work is where it should be, and help where needed

#### Representation

Act as a key contact and spokesperson

Keep in touch with DUSA

You should be 'the face' of your society

## Overall Management

Be involved in everything - always know what's going on

Stay on top of deadlines

Be aware of society finances

# AGMs & the Constitution

#### AGMs/EGMs

Need 10% of members in attendance

Can vote on society changes such as committee elections

Minimum of one per year (an AGM)

#### Constitution

YOUR society's rules

Should always be your first point of call when unsure about something

Can be altered as necessary but must be approved at AGM or EGM

#### **Bye Laws**

Available to read in full online

Rules that all societies must abide by
